Over the course of three weeks, students dive deep into Aussie culture—living with host families, joining interactive lessons, and embracing every moment of exploration.

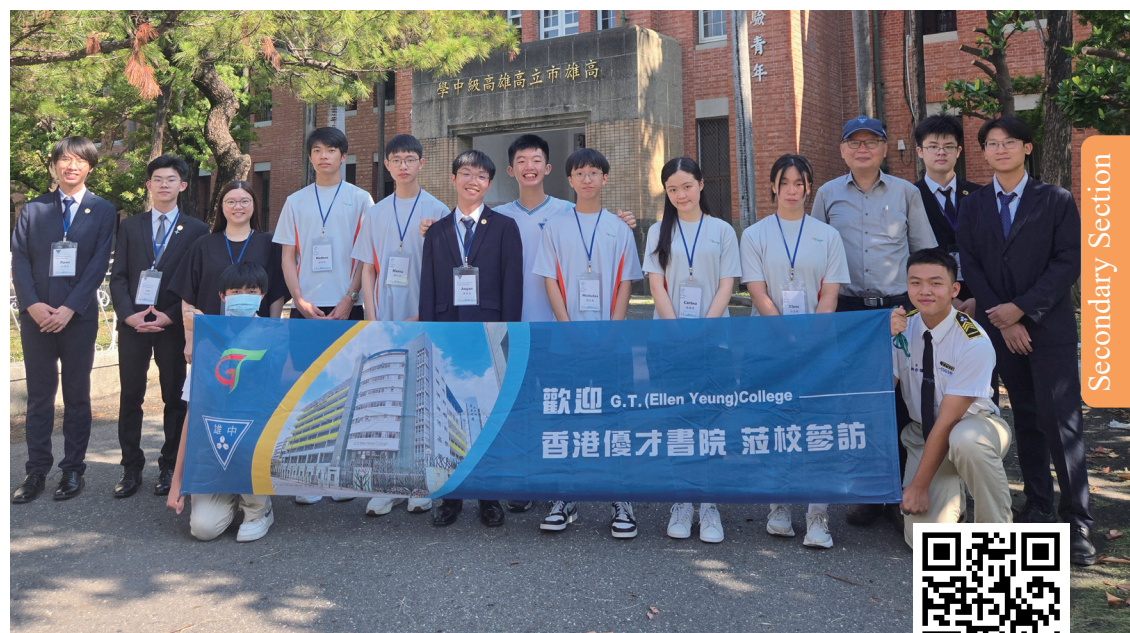

On September 11, the Grade 6 German students, led by their teacher Mr. Karsten Berning, visited the Goethe-Institut Hong Kong. Since its establishment in 1963, the Goethe-Institut has been dedicated to promoting German language education and culture, serving as an important cultural bridge between Germany and Hong Kong.

During the visit, Mr. Maik Cheung, Educational Program Coordinator at the Goethe-Institut, guided the students around the institute. The classrooms are named after various German cities—such as Berlin, Munich, and Hamburg—giving students an immediate introduction to Germany's geography and culture. Graffiti-style artwork on the walls creatively combined German vocabulary with Chinese explanations, highlighting the fun and richness of cross-cultural exchange.

Students also explored the institute's library, where shelves were filled with curated books on German literature, history, and art, alongside picture books and magazines suitable for young readers—greatly broadening their horizons.

Following the tour, the students took part in cultural learning activities organized in the library. Through games and group tasks, they learned about German festivals, cuisine, and daily life while practicing German vocabulary. The entire class was highly engaged, enthusiastically participating in the activities and showing a strong interest in both the German language and German culture.
