The 4<sup>th</sup> International Multiple Intelligences (MI) Education Forum was held in Thailand on 15–16 December 2025 and hosted by Kamnoetvidya Science Academy (KVIS). The biennial forum, initiated in 2021 by G.T. (Ellen Yeung) College of Hong Kong, convened over 140 participants from nine countries including the U.S., Thailand, India, China, the Philippines, Malaysia, Hong Kong, Azerbaijan, Pakistan, consisting of policy-makers, educators, and researchers, to extend its international influence.

Amid renewed post-pandemic momentum in MI education across Asia, Thailand has emerged as one of the regional leaders in gifted and MI education through institutions such as KVIS and Mahidol Wittayanusorn School (MWIT). The Forum featured keynote addresses by distinguished MI scholars, including Professor Howard Gardner, Professor Krissanapong, and Professor Rex Li, alongside a hybrid round-table examining the implications of artificial intelligence for MI education.

A dedicated MI teacher-training workshop led by the MI Lab and culturally grounded programmes further reinforced the Forum's commitment to CDE: Creativity, Diversity, and Excellence across educational sectors.
