## Grade 6 Students Conquer KET Exam

In Spring of 2025, last year's Grade 6 students took the Cambridge KET Exam held by the British Council. The exam's purpose is to assess students' reading, writing, listening, and speaking abilities, and awards them an internationally recognized certificate which proves their English language abilities.

Seventy students participated in the Cambridge KET Exam, which is higher than the previous year. Of the seventy participants, 44 students earned an A Grade, which is 3% higher than the previous year, and 19 students earned a B Grade, which is 8% higher than the previous year.

We are very proud of our Grade 6 students, and all the hard work they have put into their studies, especially as we see the percentage of A and B Grades increase. This year's Grade 6 students are scheduled to take the Cambridge KET Exam on 29th of March, and we know all their hard work and effort will show in their results.
