(1) Project Work

All IB students need to carry out a project for each subject as part of the internal assessment. Students who are keen on looking up information and who like to give presentation are suitable candidates.





(2) Classroom Participation

In IB, student-oriented teaching makes students more involved in learning. If your child gets involved and has a genuine interest in what he/she learns and does, the learning process in IB is fun and enjoyable.





(3) Up-to-date Resource & E-learning


Teenagers cannot live without mobile phones today. IB class may make use of electronic devices and internet resources in class activities and learning; making the learning process more diversified and enjoyable.


